In her Order of March 30, 2020, the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court authorized courts to implement an order that the time period provided in section 825 of the Penal Code within which a defendant charged with a felony offense must be taken before a magistrate was to be extended from 48 hours to 7 days.

On April 1, 2020, the San Mateo County Superior Court implemented this Order.

However, on June 10, 2020, the Chief Justice revoked her March 30 Order as it relates to PC section 825. This revocation is effective June 20, 2020.

Therefore, for arrests that occur on or after June 20, 2020, the time period provided in section 825 of the Penal Code within which a defendant in San Mateo County charged with a

1 felony offense must be taken before a magistrate reverts back to the time periods specified in
2 Penal Code Sections 825(a)(1) and (2).
