Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to health and safety concerns resulting in substantial operational impediments, and the proclamations of states of emergency by the Governor and President, it was determined that the conditions described in Government Code section 68115(a) were met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of San Mateo as of March 16, 2020; April 1 and 10, 2020; May 14, 2020; June 11, 2020; July 13, 2020; and August 12, 2020. At this Court's request, the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court issued seven prior emergency orders, authorizing the San Mateo County Superior Court to implement certain relief pursuant to Government Code section 68115. Upon the renewed request of this Court, the Chief Justice has determined that the conditions, as described in Government Code section 68115(a), continue to exist. (Gov. Code, § 68115(b).) See attached Order. Therefore, this Court orders the following:

•The San Mateo County Superior Court may hold sessions anywhere in San Mateo County, including in correctional and juvenile detention facilities, from September 1, 2020 through November 30, 2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code §68115(a)(1).

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to health and safety concerns and resulting in substantial operational impediments, and the proclamations of states of emergency by Governor Newsom and President Trump, it was determined that the conditions described in section 68115(a) of the Government Code were met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of San Mateo (Court), as of March 16, 2020; April 1 and 10, 2020; May 14, 2020; June 11, 2020; July 13, 2020; and August 12, 2020. Based on those determinations, and at the request of Presiding Judge Jonathan E. Karesh, seven prior emergency orders issued, authorizing the Court to implement certain relief under Government Code section 68115. Upon the renewed request of Presiding Judge Karesh, it is determined that the conditions described in section 68115(a) continue to exist (Gov. Code, § 68115(b)), and it is ordered that the Court is authorized to do the following:

• Hold sessions anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile detention facilities, from September 1, 2020, through November 30, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(1)).
